Amy Costa, Full Moon Strategies, provided an update on the state’s judicial efforts to prevent the U.S Department of Agriculture from using Supplement Nutrition Assistance Program’s applicant information for purposes unrelated to administering federal benefits and to challenge the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services’ removal of seven vaccines from the universally recommended childhood schedule and replacement of members on the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices. She also provided updates on Governor Newsom’s new statewide accountability measures and funding for homelessness and mental health; the Assembly Budget Subcommittee No. 2 on Human Services’ oversight hearing on February 25, 2026; and the latest polling for the gubernatorial election.
