**I. Federal Legislative Update**

**A. Legislative Update – Informational Item – CJ Lake**

Emily Bacque Da Silva and John Assini, CJ Lake, provided an update on the federal legislature and updates on key federal policies such as the FY26 appropriation bills, healthcare, and federal funding freezes for five states.

The House and Senate are both in session the week of January 12 through January 16, 2026. The Senate will be out of session next week, January 19 through January 23, 2026, and back in session on January 26, 2026. The House will be in session next week, January 19 through January 23, 2026, and out of session the week of January 26 through January 30, 2026.

**State Legislation**

**A. Legislative Update – Informational Item – Full Moon Strategies**

Amy Costa, Full Moon Strategies provided an update on the Governor's Proposed Budget and how federal legislation is and will be affecting the budget in the next few years. Ms. Costa also reported a federal judge ruling that temporarily blocks the Trump administration from freezing \$10 billion in welfare funds for 5 states and that Attorney General Rob Bonta announced he will not enter the gubernatorial election and will rerun for Attorney General.

- January 20, 2026: Assembly Budget Committee
- January 21, 2026: Senate Budget Committee

Key legislative deadlines:

- January 10, 2026: Governor must submit the proposed State Budget.
- January 16, 2026: Last day for Policy Committees to hear Fiscal Bills in the First House.
- January 24, 2026: Last day to submit bill requests to the Office of Legislative Counsel.
- January 31, 2026: Two-year bills must pass their house of origin.
