**I. Federal Legislative Update – CJ Lake**

**A. Legislative Update**

John Assini, CJ Lake and Emily Bacque da Silva, CJ Lake provided an update on federal legislation.

The Senate and the House will begin the Second Session of the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress with several policy deadlines approaching such as the remaining unaddressed FY 2026 appropriation bills, healthcare premium tax credits, and health care policies.

Action

**II. State Legislation**

**A. Legislative Update – Full Moon Strategies**

Amy Costa, Full Moon Strategies provided an update on the state legislature.

The Legislature reconvenes this week with leadership and committee changes for the 2026 legislative session. Health care policy will dominate the agenda as the One Big Beautiful Bill will result in extreme funding shortages.

A federal judge ruled on December 29, 2025, that the Trump administration can resume sharing Medicaid data about undocumented immigrants with Immigration and Customs Enforcement starting January 6, 2026.

The Attorney General's Office has filed 52 lawsuits during the first year of Trump's second term, winning or settling about 80% of them and claiming \$168 billion in benefits for the state. Many cases remain unresolved including challenges to Trump's tariffs and California's vehicle emission standards.

Key legislative deadlines:

- January 10, 2026: Governor must submit the proposed State Budget.
- January 16, 2026: Last day for Policy Committees to hear Fiscal Bills in the First House.
- January 24, 2026: Last day to submit bill requests to the Office of Legislative Counsel.
- January 31, 2026: Two-year bills must pass their house of origin.
