OFFICE ERGONOMICS: WORKSTATION SAFETY TRAINING PROGRAM

AUDIENCE:

This program has been designed for employees who work at computers.

PURPOSE:

This training shall describe and demonstrate the proper ergonomic principles to prevent injuries, and to improve safety and efficiency in the workplace.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Familiarize employees with issues that concern their comfort, safety, and productivity at the workstation.
- 2. Increase their awareness of how they can use practical solutions to improve their work environment.
- 3. Suggest simple applications of workplace design or redesign to reduce problems.
- 4. Discuss and demonstrate workstation exercises.

LENGTH OF PROGRAM: 2.5 hours
