**SUBJECT: AWARD A CONTRACT TO CAPRA ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICE, CORP.
FOR GOAT GRAZING SERVICES; MASTER CONTRACT NO. 902247;
PROCUREMENT CONTRACT NO. 25313; AMOUNT: \$1,550,401**

RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the Purchasing Agent, or their designee, to execute a contract (Master Contract No. 902247; Procurement Contract No. 25313) with Capra Environmental Service, Corp. (Principal: Paul Abess; Location: Rancho Cordova) to provide goat grazing services to the Alameda County Public Works Agency and Alameda County General Services Agency, for the term of 6/1/23 – 5/31/26, in the amount of \$1,550,401.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

Goat grazing has become an essential part of the vegetation management strategy employed by the Alameda County Public Works Agency (PWA) in collaboration with the Alameda County Flood Control and Water Conservation District and Alameda County General Services Agency–Building Maintenance Department (GSA-BMD). Goat grazing is a proven vegetation management tool used to suppress invasive species, control overgrown vegetation, reduce threats of fires and floods, manage inaccessible or hard-to-reach land or land that is difficult to manage, and lessen power tools' usage.

The Contractor will supply, utilize, and care for a goat herd distributed across multiple locations in the lands of the District and County. The goats will be deployed into various open space areas and allowed to graze until sufficient vegetation is removed to reduce the threat of fire and/or flood at that location.

SELECTION CRITERIA/PROCESS:

The PWA and GSA-BMD have determined that Alameda County does not currently have the resources to provide goat grazing services.

The PWA and GSA-BMD worked with GSA–Procurement to develop a Request for Quotation (RFQ), which was issued on February 7, 2023, posted on the website for 37 days, sent to the E-Gov Goods and Services – Current Contract Opportunities mailing service, and emailed to the Chambers of Commerce e-mail group. The RFQ was also advertised in the The Inter-City Express on February 9, 2023 and the Oakland Post on February 15, 2023. A vendor outreach was conducted on February 15, 2023, followed by one networking/bidders conference on February 17, 2023, that was attended by six potential bidders.

On March 16, 2023, three bidders submitted responses to the RFQ. All responses were evaluated by GSA-Procurement and the Client Departments based on the price for goat grazing services.

Capra Environmental Service, Corp. was the lowest cost responsible vendor and is being recommended for award.

The Small Local Emerging Business (SLEB) requirement was included in this RFQ; however, there were no subcontracting opportunities available due to the nature of the services. The Office of Acquisition Policy has issued a SLEB Waiver No. 8789 (Expiring: 5/31/26).


