SUBJECT: Approval of FY 2010-2011 Contract funding levels for the Area

Agency on Aging

RECOMMENDATION:

Submitted at this time for your Board's approval are the recommendations for Older American's Act and Older Californians Act funding, based on the 2011–2014 Request for Proposals recently completed by the Alameda County Area Agency on Aging (AAA) and the Advisory Commission on Aging. To continue providing services to the seniors served by the AAA, it is recommended that your Board:

- 1. Approve the final RFP recommendations of the Advisory Commission on Aging and related contracts for Older Americans Act and Older Californians Act funding as detailed in Attachment A; and
- 2. Approve funding augmentations to CBO Master Contracts listed on Attachment A for FY 2010-2011, totaling, \$5,066,169, with authority to renew for up to three additional Fiscal Year periods though June 30, 2014, with maximum amounts not to exceed levels shown, and delegate authority to the Social Services Agency Director, or designee, to execute contracts under the Master Contract process.
- 3. Authorize an additional appropriation of \$547,931 completely offset by additional revenue, as detailed in the attached financial recommendation for FY 2009/10 Older Americans Act and Older Californians Act one-time only funds.

DISCUSSION/SUMMARY:

This letter requests action by your Board to approve the final RFP recommendations of the Alameda County Advisory Commission on Aging for Older Americans Act and Older Californians Act funding for 2011-2014, and to approve contracts for FY 2010-2011 based on these recommendations. Under guidelines established by the Older Americans Act, Area Agencies on Aging are required to release a competitive RFP at least once every four years to assure fair and open competition for all services under these acts. The AAA's RFP process was developed to comply with Federal and State regulations, to be without bias, and to withstand appeals in regard to the fairness of the proceedings.

On an annual basis, the AAA provides services to more than 29,000 seniors in Alameda County. The AAA's delivery of services is informed by its Area Plan, which calls for a comprehensive network of services that enhance the health and well being of seniors.

In January 2010, the AAA released RFP's for the following programs: Nutrition Services, Supportive Services, Family Caregiver Support Program, Health Insurance Counseling and Assistance Program, Senior Community Employment Service Program, & Ombudsman. All programs receive federal funding and, as a result, received a SLEB waiver.

The funding recommendations attached include a broad spectrum of services for low-income seniors including but not limited to meals, case management services, disease prevention services, and information and assistance for monolingual populations.

This letter also requests approval of an appropriation increase to allow payment for contract amendments approved by your Board on May 18, 2010. The costs of these amendments are completely offset by additional Federal and State revenues.

SELECTION CRITERIA/PROCESS:

The AAA published the RFP's in January 2010 through the GSA website and through its own email distribution list, which includes several hundred community stakeholders. The RFP included minimum service standards and detailed service unit descriptions, consistent with state and federal requirements for service delivery for each program.

The AAA conducted at least one Bidder's Conference for every RFP. All questions and answers from the Bidder's Conference were posted on the GSA website. As outlined in the RFP, agencies were evaluated on the following: 1) Mission, Experience and Community Involvement, 2) Program Delivery, and 3) Administrative and Fiscal Qualifications. Evaluation of agencies included their ability to meet targeting standards to serve low-income and minority populations in your communities. The recommendations of the Advisory Commission on Aging for the award of the Older Americans Act and Older Californians Act funds are based on the 2011-2014 Request for Proposal process. Seventy-one applicants submitted requests totaling \$5,219,823 in funds. All applications were reviewed and scored by panelists using criteria established in the RFP. Fifty-eight of the applicants received recommendations for funding. Recommendations for funding were based on the availability of funds, applicants'

ranking within program categories, and the intra-county funding formula approved by your Board for services for seniors.

The AAA received appeals from four agencies. As outlined in the RFP, all agencies were able to appeal in person, at the April 12, 2010 commission meeting, and to appeal in writing. In accordance with the process articulated in the RFP, the AAA established an Appeals panel. After careful deliberation, the panel denied all Appeals requests. The Appeals Panel presented their recommendation to the Advisory Commission on Aging at their regularly scheduled meeting on May 10, 2010. The Commission adopted their recommendation and is recommending that your Board approve and authorize awards to vendors in amounts as detailed in Attachment A.

FINANCING:

Financing for services resulting from the Request for Proposals will come from Federal and State funds awarded to Alameda County by the California Department of Aging for FY 2010-2011. All funding is included in the Social Services budget for 2010-2011. There is no change to net County cost as a result of approval of the Advisory Commission on Aging recommendations for approval in principal contracts.
