Please provide a brief description of your organization and the proposed community outreach event:

Finding Má is a documentary and healing-centered project led by Thanh Tran, a formerly incarcerated Amerasian/Vietnamese and Black filmmaker. The film follows Thanh's journey to reconnect with his siblings and search for their unhoused mother after decades of separation caused by incarceration, foster care, and addiction. The story reflects the lives of many Alameda County families impacted by Realignment and systemic injustice.

We are hosting *Stories That Heal: An Evening of Film, Art, and Community* on **Thursday, October 2, 2025**, at the **Oakland Block Community Hub**, from **4–7 PM**. This event brings together directly impacted families, reentry organizers, artists, and community members for a cultural fundraiser centered on healing and collective power.

The event features a preview of *Finding Má*, live music, a custom sneaker art auction, a resource table area, and flash talks from system-impacted leaders. We are requesting **\$10,000** to support community access and healing-centered programming that aligns with CCPEC's goals.
