AC Reentry Housing Vendor Pool	The Housing Vendor Pool will help establish immediate assistance to participants who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. Services available include: housing case management, emergency shelter, transitional housing, assistance securing long-term housing and short-term rental assistance, if needed. Flexibility allows responsiveness to the needs of participants.	TBD	Bidders conference complete, addendum will be posted by 2/24. Bids due 3/9/21.
Female & Male Residential Multi-Service Center	Residential Program that will have wrap-around services on site and help transition individuals from incarceration, to stability to community.	\$ 2,000,000	The RFP is being drafted with GSA. Draft will be complete by the end of this week.
Education (New Bid)	Provides high school diploma, GED, or HiSet. Career training, English as a second language, and other academic support and resources, as well as, transitional services and college tuition assistance.	TBD	The current contract expires 12/31/21. Family Reunification: Legal & Therapy Services (Re-Bid)	Therapy & Legal Services in Support of Family Reunification Programs are evidence-based programs that work with current and formerly incarcerated individuals to promote successful reunification with family members and/or support systems.	\$ 1,000,000	GSA is reviewing the proposed scope, anticipated release in early 2021.
Sex Offender Treatment	Required sex offender treatment	\$ 550,000	RFP and Bid Package are being finalized and will be released in early March.
Cognitive Behavior Intervention Services & Incentives	For all Probation supervised clients To be provided to all individuals supervised by Probation to ensure better programming outcomes by addressing criminal thinking.	\$ 500,000	RFP Released 2/10, Bidders Conference 2/25, Bids Due 3/31 by 2:00pm.
Client Resource Forums	Establish CBO-operated Client Resource Forums county-wide This would fund a CBO who will run meetings within the community for clients to receive information about services, connect with one another, and connect with other providers.	\$ 250,000	SOW being edited and will be routed for management approval by early March, posting anticipated in April.
Leadership & Entrepreneurship	Funding for smaller organizations owned and operated by formerly incarcerated to ensure that when additional funding is released, the RFP targets the formerly incarcerated who own and/or operate businesses.	\$ 1,000,000	SOW is being developed.
Faith-Based/Local Community Partnerships	Include Faith Partners in effort to support clients. This line item is intended to acknowledge and provide support to those smaller organizations that are already doing the work, not for organizations to start a service. Unresolved issues: There are many small church organizations that do the work but do not have the infrastructure necessary to perform on a county contract nor negotiate the County procurement process.	\$ 1,000,000	SOW is being developed.

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Women/Mother's Services	Dr. Barbara Bloom (toolkit attached) and Kim Carter with a Time for Change model for women's services.	\$ 1,000,000	Listening Session is scheduled for 3/5 at 11AM. SOW is being developed.
Transition Aged Youth Services/Support	CBOs and governmental partners need help with the youth-to-adult transition, along with communication between all parties.	\$ 1,000,000	A listening session is being scheduled for early 2021, the SOW is being researched.
Kinship Reentry Workforce	Program in development	\$ 250,000	SOW has been reviewed and will be routed to GSA imminently for finalization and release.
Evidenced-Based Practices Capacity Building Workshops	Capacity building for smaller organizations (similar to the CCF) who are working with the reentry population but have never received County funding or very little, under \$100,000.	\$ 500,000	SOW needs to be researched
LGBTQ Transgender Resources	Develop list of resources for the LGBTQ community	\$ 100,000	SOW needs to be researched
Restorative Justice Circles for Adults	Circles of Support & Accountability (Fresno Pacific University's Center for Peacemaking – COSA program) Have Circles (modeled after San Quentin Circles) Issue to be resolved: Is this pre-conviction as well as post- conviction? Are these circles or restorative justice models that include the victim and perhaps victim restitution?	\$ 1,000,000	SOW needs to be researched
Father Services	Programs with child-friendly services that supports single fathers, including and beyond treatment This item will provide services that address the needs of custodial parents that are fathers and will address the lack of services for parenting fathers.	\$ 250,000	SOW research being conducted.

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Indigent/Barrier Removal Fund	<p>Assistance with cell phone bills to keep clients connected</p> <p>Assistance to pay for post office boxes or physical addresses for clients who are homeless</p> <p>Prescription/medical coverage (until Medi-Cal is obtained), birth certificate, social security card, return to work documents, Driver's License, etc.</p> <p>Funds available for childcare/preschool & afterschool care</p> <p>Funds to support housing needs</p> <p>Pay for technology (internet)</p> <p>This funding is intended for short-term/immediate needs as individuals are applying and/or waiting for long-term services. This fund will help stabilize individuals until they are able to get connected to more permanent services. The funds will need to be capped on a dollars/person basis. Individuals must be engaged in services to be eligible for the funds.</p> <p>To be determined: Development of very specific guidelines for what the funds could be used for, accounting of the funds, what happens if any part goes unused, and limits per client.</p>	\$ 2,000,000	on-hold
Clinics for Reentry Legal Barrier Removal	Ensure that people understand what those barriers are and increase self-advocacy tools.	\$ 250,000	SOW needs to be researched
Reentry Client Access Communication and Service Portal	The portal will be used to develop an interactive client application used by clients to access services, reach Deputy Probation Officers, and more.	\$ 300,000	SOW needs to be researched
Opioid and Alcohol Use Prevention Programs	Program under review	\$ 500,000	SOW needs to be researched
Prison Pre-Release Planning and Case Management	Better pre-release planning with transportation planning; provide essential services for first 72 hours post-release; warm hand-offs (not in name only but in practice) to help those with small things like taking the bus, how to use the phone, etc.; include peer-mentoring for those leaving prison; system to track release processes to be better able to anticipate and plan for release.	\$ 1,000,000	SOW needs to be researched
