Oakland: Parmerships and Strategies to Address * There are a number of services aimed to assist at-promise youth and their families. These services are effective, however some atpromise youth are falling through the cracks. * Steps taken by Probation: Collaborating with the Oakland Department of Violence Prevention (DVP); currently working on MOU Case conferences to get resources to kids and families A DPO will be designated full-time to work on this project Coordinate with OPD so they are aware there is a team in place Ideas offered in discussion: Diversion programs have been successful in Collaborative Court Mental Health Collaborative model; meets twice a month and discuss the kids' needs; case management Mental Health Collaborative model; meets twice a month and discuss the kids' needs; case management Kids are in need of trusting relationships; In collaborative court the kids see the same staff and develop relationships Providers need to have stable staffing to help build trusting relationships Mental Health Court to help kids get to medical appointments, school, or home. Need to provide services for increased stability MDFT provides wraparound services but it is not centered around mental health care Many programs have long wait lists due to labor shortages Services should be provided to the younger kids before they get involved in the criminal justice system Behavioral Health is working on a MOU and Operational Protocols with Collaborative Court Referral to ICM may not be appropriate for an 11 or 12 year old Christine Gerchow would like to participate on what this could look like for younger youth Baltimore's Thread Model – intensive community wraparound.
