Jin Sung is a community leader whose work spans arts education, economic development, civic engagement, and faith-based leadership. She is the founder and chief executive leader behind OASIS Center International, the EPICENTER Foundation, and Café OASIS, and also serves as Pastor of OASIS Christian Church, which she founded. Across these platforms, Jin works to strengthen underserved communities through creativity, access, opportunity, and purpose.

Jin founded OASIS Center International in 2012 with a vision to empower underprivileged youth through artistic expression, responsible citizenship, and personal growth. Since its founding, OASIS has served youth in low-income communities across California by providing arts education, mentorship, and platforms for confidence-building, creativity, and self-expression. Her work later expanded in response to the broader economic challenges facing the families and communities OASIS served. In 2020, amid the economic disruption intensified by the COVID-19 pandemic, Jin founded the EPICENTER Foundation, a HUD-approved housing counseling agency focused on housing stability, financial education, and upward economic mobility in underserved communities. Through EPICENTER, she works across the nonprofit, corporate, and financial sectors to advance minority access, economic stability, and broader community opportunity.

Jin also founded OASIS Christian Church as a faith-based platform rooted in spiritual formation, leadership development, and community transformation. Her pastoral leadership reflects her conviction that lasting change must address both practical needs and deeper questions of identity, purpose, and calling.

Café OASIS represents the next evolution of Jin's mission. Founded and led by Jin as Chief Executive Officer, Café OASIS was developed as a community-centered café, creative hub, and workforce development platform in Santa Ana. It was created to provide a permanent space where arts, mentorship, entrepreneurship, civic connection, and economic opportunity can converge.

The project reflects years of planning, partnership-building, fundraising, permitting, design, and construction coordination, and serves as a physical expression of OASIS Center International's long-term commitment to community transformation.

The purpose behind Café OASIS is rooted in Jin's belief that underserved communities need not only programs, but also permanent places of belonging, growth, and opportunity. Café OASIS is designed to support youth workforce development, cultural engagement, community education, and cross-sector collaboration while creating a welcoming environment for young people, families, artists, civic leaders, and community partners.

Beyond her nonprofit leadership, Jin leads the Advocacy Alliance for Corporate Social Responsibility (AACSR), a joint minority coalition composed of regional and statewide community-based organizations, advocacy groups, and civic stakeholders across California. Through AACSR, she advances corporate social responsibility, economic and community development, environmental sustainability, and equitable access to resources through structured community engagement, indirect public policy advocacy, and cross-sector collaboration.

In addition, Jin currently serves on advisory boards for Columbia Bank, Citizens Business Bank, Mechanics Bank, and PG&E, providing community-impact insight and policy-relevant perspective to institutional leadership. She has also served on advisory boards for T-Mobile, Charter Communications, Frontier Communications, Royal Business Bank, Capital Corp, Faith & Community Empowerment, Azusa Pacific University's Public Policy School, and Saint Mary's College of California. She was also a founding member and Chairman of the National Diversity Coalition, serving through 2022.

Across her work, Jin is guided by a consistent mission: translating vision into measurable impact and building platforms where creativity, economic opportunity, civic leadership, faith, and purpose converge for lasting community transformation.
