



ALAMEDA COUNTY COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP (CCP)

California's Community Corrections Partnerships (CCPs) are local bodies established by law to create and implement public safety realignment plans, which shifted responsibility for certain lower-level offenders from the state to counties.

Chaired by the Chief Probation Officer, each CCP includes a diverse group of local officials and community stakeholders who develop plans for supervision and rehabilitative services, funded by the county's Community Corrections Performance Incentives Fund

BACKGROUND:

In 2025 the CCP collaborated with individuals with lived experience, service providers and key stakeholders to the revise their internal working structure. Drawing on the successes and an analysis of the challenges in delivering realignment services for over a decade, resulted in a streamlined configuration of workgroups better suited to deliver impactful services to Alameda County's diverse communities.
