Three Goals

Reduce The Prison Population

Decrease the number of people going in to prison:

New classification, Non, Non, Non

Transfer the responsibility of those coming out of prison from the state to the county: PRCS

Parole Violators:
Local community-based punishment

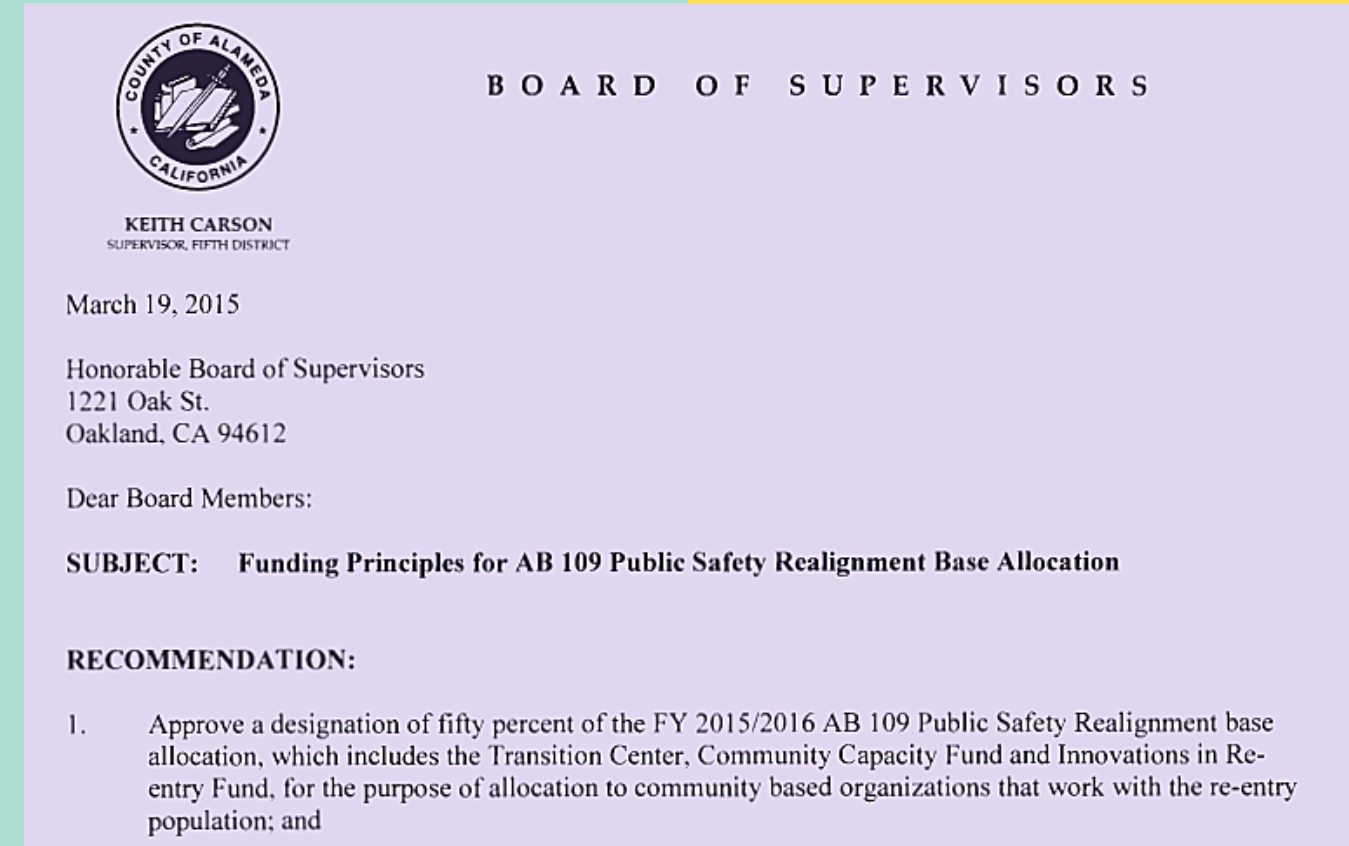
Reduce Recidivism

Evidence-Based Practices:
Engagement in sentencing, supervision practices and services demonstrated by scientific research to reduce recidivism

Reduce Corrections Spending

Reduce corrections and related criminal justice spending and reinvest savings in strategies designed to increase public safety

In 2015, Alameda County
decided half the Realignment
funds received from the State
should go to CBO's
Fifty Percent



Community Corrections Partnership

Executive Committee

The Community Corrections Partnership (CCP), established in Penal Code § 1230 was tasked with developing a Realignment plan and the CCP Executive Committee established in AB 109 was tasked with **oversight, implementation and assessment** of that plan, including providing the Alameda County Board of Supervisors with AB 109 funding recommendations.



CC/PEEC Workgroups

Data and Information Management Workgroup

Design and develop a comprehensive, integrated data management system that allows tracking of individuals, outcomes, and costs

Process and Evaluation Workgroup

Define and develop the plan for, implementation, and evaluation of, Realignment activities in Alameda County

Fiscal and Procurement Workgroup

Develop an annual Realignment allocation plan and procedures for effective and efficient procurement

Programs and Services Workgroup

Ensure availability of, and access to, effective, results-oriented services for Realignment populations from the continuum of charging through successful reentry

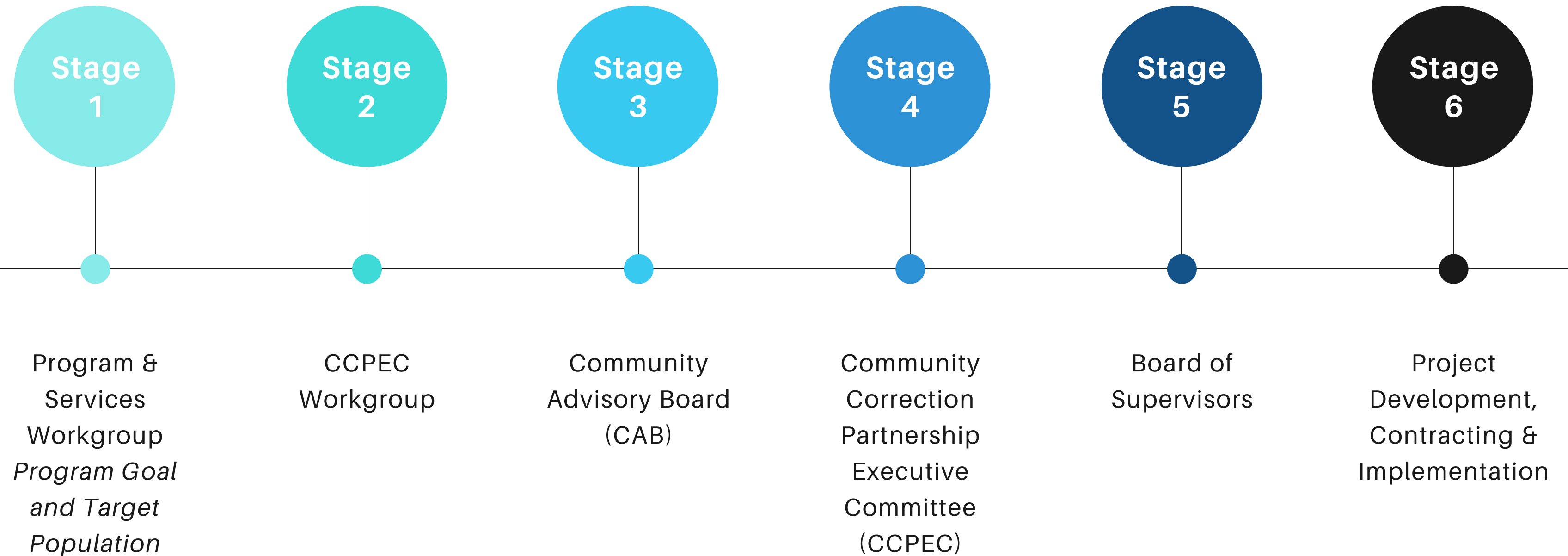
Program Design

Alameda County Realignment *Eligibility*

1. Post-Release Community Supervision
2. Mandatory Supervision (split sentence) & Deferred Entry of Judgement (1170(h) eligible)
3. Formal Probation
4. Pre-Trial
5. Specialty Courts (Felony Conviction)
