

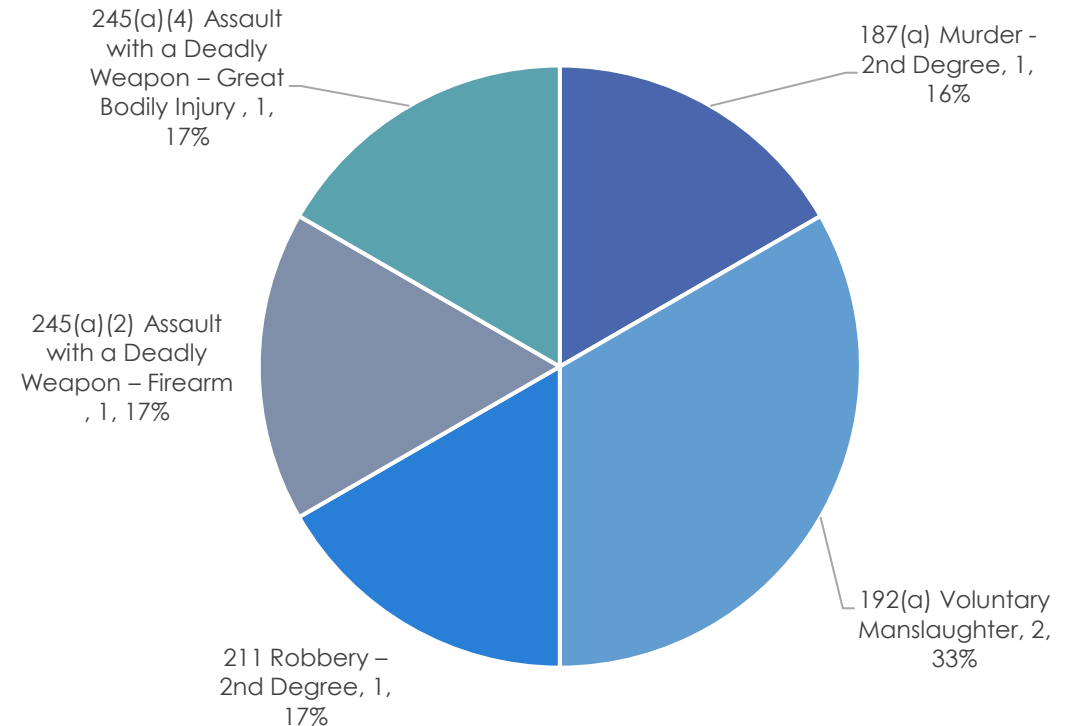
SB823 2026, Q2 Update

707 (b) Adjudications, DJJ Commitments, and Secure Track Sustained Totals (Cumulative)

- 24 707(b) referrals sustained during the reporting period across 23 individual youth
- 0 youth were committed to DJJ
- 0 youth returned from DJJ
- 0 reinstated commitment to SYTF
- 6 new commitments to SYTF

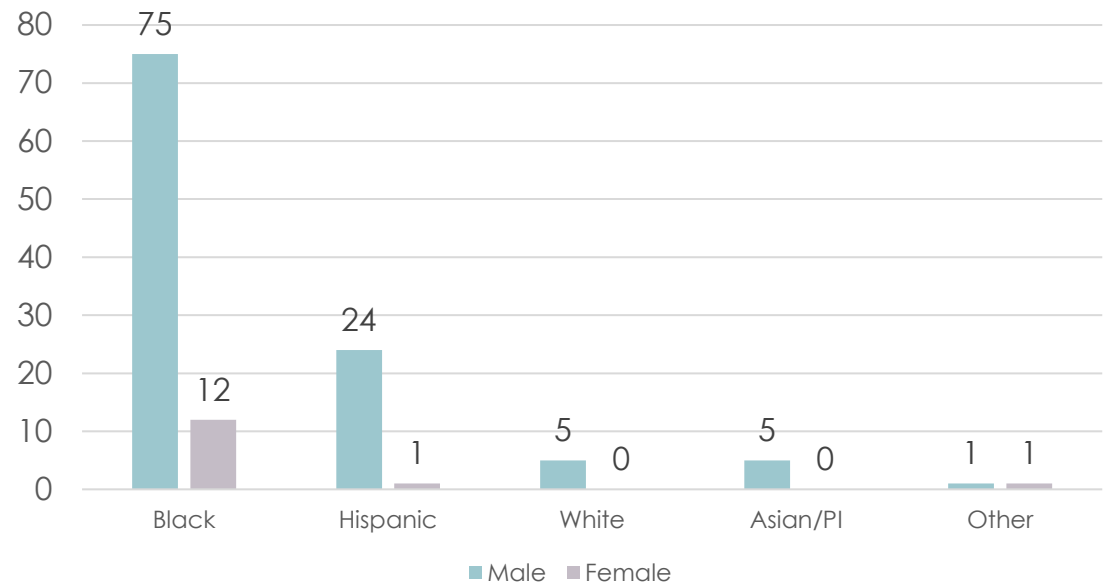
Most Serious Offense for Youth with New Secure Track Commitments (n = 6)



Youth Eligible for SYTF Under WIC 875(a)

- 124 youth with a sustained 707(b) offense were active to probation during the quarter
 - 110 (89%) youth were male
 - 14 (11%) youth were female
 - 87 (70%) youth were Black
 - 25 (20%) youth were Hispanic

Youth Age 14+ w/ Sustained 707(b) Offenses Based on the most Recent Referral (n = 124)

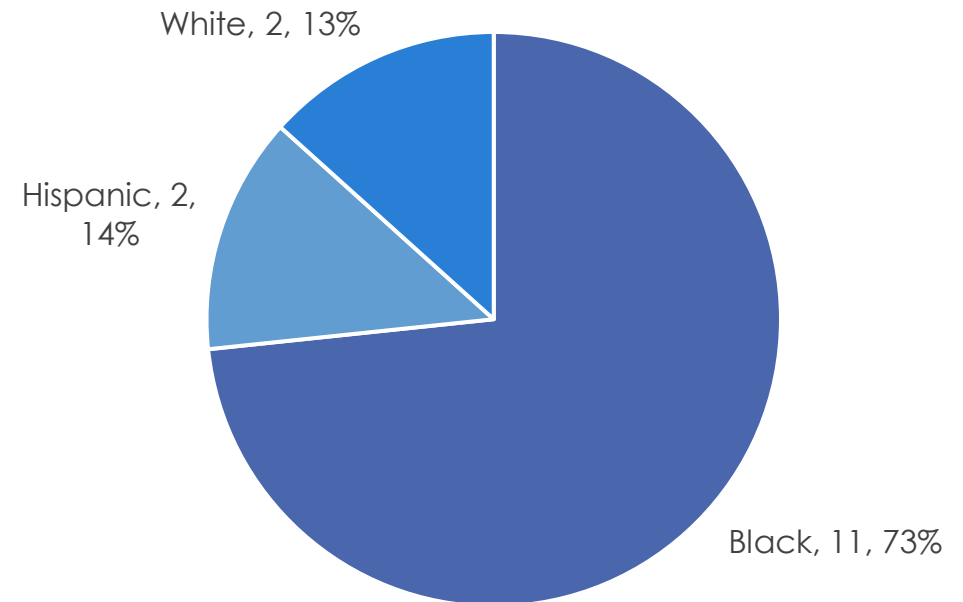


Overview of Youth Committed to SYTF*

- 15 youth were committed to SYTF as of June 30, 2026
 - 100% of youth were court ordered
 - 87% of youth were male
 - 13% of youth were female
 - 40% of youth were from Oakland
 - The average age of youth was 18.3
 - The average length of time in SYTF 298 days

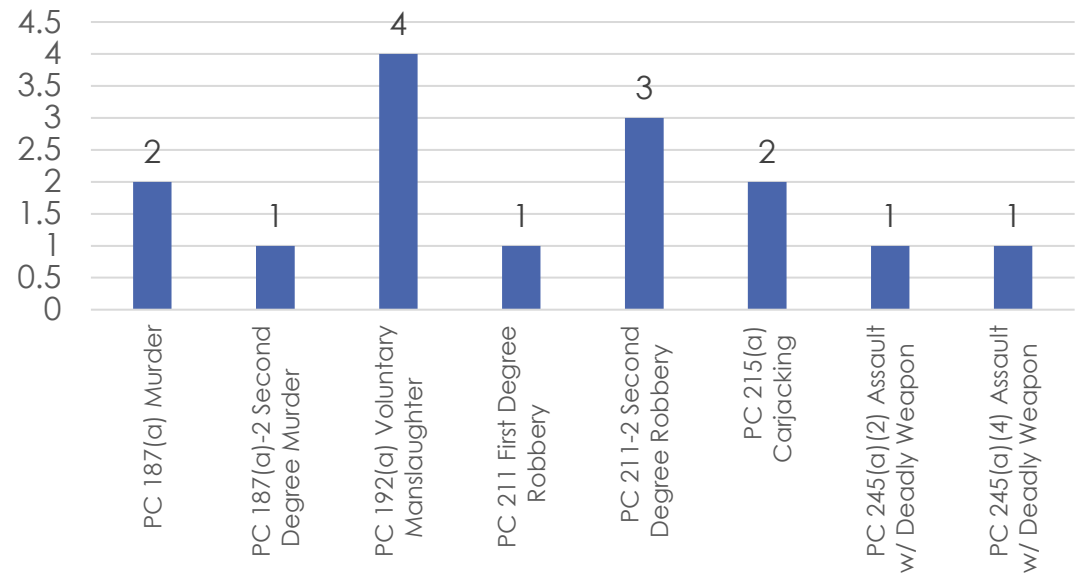
Race of Youth Committed to SYTF (n = 15)



Overview of Youth Committed to SYTF Cont.*

- For the 15 youth, the average
 - Number of *referrals* prior to SYTF commitment was 4.1
 - Number of *bookings* prior to SYTF commitment was 2.9
 - Number of *true findings* prior to SYTF commitment was 2.3
 - Time between 1st referral and SYTF commitment was 3.1 years

Step-downs and Closures*

- As of June 30, 2026,
 - 12 youth were on step-down from SYTF to a less restrictive program
 - These programs included step-down to camp, GPS, community supervision, and interstate compact. In this case there were 9 camp step-downs, 2 community supervision step-downs, and 1 GPS step-down.
 - 33 youth had their Secure Track grant closed since program inception
 - This includes youth with jurisdiction transfers and youth whose cases were closed out with the ACPD due to a transfer on interstate compact (IC), in addition to youth whose cases were closed due to their term ending, being discharged early, or an unsuccessful completion.
 - As of June 30, 2026, 3 youth were closed out due to jurisdictional and IC transfers & 1 youth was released back to DJJ due to 779 motion being denied.
 - The average length of time in SYTF for closed and transferred youth was 361 days
